Connected Care - Community Health Centre at Market Mall

Ever wonder what the Community Health Centre in Market Mall is for?

It was developed to serve older adults (50+) with non-life threatening complex care needs in Saskatoon. It aims to help you:

- Avoid going to hospital unless necessary
- Remain at home by connecting with appropriate services
- By bringing services closer to home
- By providing education on how stay healthy & safe at home

And can also help you:

- Access Client Patient Access Services (CPAS) for referrals to Home Care and Therapies
- Access a Community Mental Health Nurse

The Community Health Centre is **not** a replacement for your family physician. They will work with your family physician to provide care within your community.

What kind of services are available there?

- Medical assessment by a physician with a focus on senior's health issues
- Education and health promotion
- Follow-up after a hospital visit
- Access to community partners such as Saskatoon Council on Aging, Navera Counselling, Alzheimer's Society, and Live Well with Diabetes


WALK FOR PARISH NURSING FUNDRAISER
