

In the Advent wreath shown below, color two candles, then unscramble the letters and discover an important message from the prophet Isaiah and John the Baptist.






#### Build a road and get ready!

Isaiah 40:1-11


Isaiah the prophet and John the Baptist both worked hard telling people about God and reminding them to get ready for the Messiah, God's chosen one.






#### Meet John the Baptist

God sent John the Baptist to help people get ready for Jesus. John said, "Prepare the way of the Lord!" John helped people get ready by baptizing them in the Jordan River.



Where do you see the color blue in your worship space?





Connect the dotted lines to complete the Advent wreath. Color the candles blue. Color the wreath green.






"Tell God you're sorry for your sins! Turn your life around," John said.
